

Membership

While retention is necessary, we haven't forgotten about the importance of recruiting as well, so we will be issuing an additional individual recruiter challenge this month!

To focus on retention, we will be acknowledging the top Post in each membership division that shows the most renewals and Life member upgrades during the month of May. If a member pays their 2023 dues, whether annual or Life, this will be credited toward this month's challenge and the top Post in each division will receive a unique statue to display at your Post commemorating this important membership goal!

In addition, the top recruiter in each division during the month of May will receive a special recruiter plaque to recognize their part in helping grow and strengthen our membership. We want to see you all going out to bring new members into the VFW!

We have had a historic membership year so far, and we want to continue to keep that momentum going. Through recruiting new members and retaining the members we have, we will continue to show our strength as an organization, to help our fellow veterans and their families, and to prove to the world that EVERY VETERAN COUNTS!

This Post contest will count the number of annual members in a Post who pay membership dues, either annual or Life, from May 1 through May 31, 2023. Dues payments processed online before close of business will be credited that day, payments made through the mail will be processed when received. The recruiter plaque award will count all new and reinstated members recruited between May 1 and May 31, 2023. Awards will take approximately six weeks to mail. VFW Foundation

Plenty of funding remains available to VFW Posts, Districts, and their Auxiliaries through the VFW Foundation's grant programs. There are currently two opportunities available to Posts: (1) Community Support Grant; (2) Uniting to Combat Hunger (UTCH) Grant. One opportunity is available to Districts: District Corporate Partnership Grant.

Through these grants, Posts and Districts can receive \$1,500 in reimbursement for various qualifying projects. The applications for these grants, which include guidelines, can be accessed by visiting wfw.org/grants and wfw.org/utch-grant. VFW National Convention

CONVENTION HOUSING: 124th National Convention housing opened Feb. 17, 2023. A memo was sent out to the VFW Departments on April 10, 2023, with the following information:

We are **71** days until housing cut-off (**June 21**) for the July 22-27, 2023 convention in Phoenix, Arizona.

We have had an overwhelming number of early housing reservations for the National Convention. Due to this early booking pattern, many state Department blocks are now **sold-out**. For those sold-out Departments with new reservations, many individuals have been placed on a **wait list** for their assigned hotels.

In order to accommodate this growing wait list, all remaining rooms at each hotel (VFW Department blocks) will be placed into one **common block of rooms**, known as "free-sell." This means any remaining available rooms in each state block will no longer be earmarked for a specific state and will be part of the <u>free-sell</u> <u>block</u>, giving every state in its assigned hotel the ability to book rooms from the <u>free-sell block</u> and allowing us/VFW to fill the contracted room blocks at the hotels.

NOTE: All wait list requests will be fulfilled before new reservations are processed.

If your Department has rooms remaining in your assigned block, your attendees have until **Monday, April 17** to book these rooms. **Beginning, Tuesday, April 18,** any remaining rooms will be put into the **free-sell** block to fulfill wait listed requests. Beyond that, all subsequent new housing reservations will be taken from the "**free-sell block**" **based on availability.** Room type requests will be honored when possible, however, it will be dependent on the availability of each type of room in each hotel.

VFW National is under contract with the current VFW hotels, therefore it is our goal to utilize all rooms contracted in each of those hotels **first** to avoid any penalties for not filling the contracted blocks.

In the event a hotel or hotels sell out completely, we will make every attempt, based on availability, to secure additional rooms at that hotel. If there are no additional rooms available to us, we will continue to fill up the other official VFW hotels to satisfy our contractual obligations before we move forward to secure additional rooms (overflow) at other nearby hotels. If this occurs beyond the cut-off date of June 21, a determination will be made if VFW National is in a position to sign a contract for overflow hotel(s) and to be obligated should those contracted overflow rooms not be utilized.

We encourage your attendees to make their reservations now for the National Convention. We <u>cannot</u> guarantee there will be availability through housing **cutoff of June 21** as the rooms are booking quickly and are <u>first come</u>, <u>first served</u>.

DISPLAYING MILITARY SERVICE SYMBOLS. Military service flags, insignias, etc. should be displayed in the following order (left to right as you face the flags): Army, Marine Corps, Navy, Air Force, Space Force and then Coast Guard. For military flags, go to wfwstore.org/searchresults?q=MilitaryFlag.

ALL-AMERICAN DASHBOARD. Please encourage Posts to read the 2022-23 Membership Program. Military Assistance Program grants have been launched to show Departments and Posts how much in grant assistance has been received from National Headquarters to supplement the Unmet Needs financial grants and VFW Sport Clips Help-A-Hero scholarship statistics. U.S. FLAG HALF-STAFF REMINDER. The U.S. Flag should be at half-staff on Peace Officers Memorial Day on Monday, May 15.

HALF-STAFF U.S. FLAG. The U.S. Flag should be at half-staff on Memorial Day, the last Monday in May (federal holiday - half-staff until noon). Flags available at VFW Store <u>vfwstore.org/category/flags/usflags</u>.

FLAG DAY, JUNE 14. All VFW units are reminded to properly display the U.S. Flag on Flag Day, Wednesday, June 14 and to conduct a ceremony or program as feasible. You may contact the VFW Communications Department for a Flag Day speech. It is also suggested Posts should award the VFW Patriotic Citizen Award (Product No. 4385) for those who have daily displayed our National flag.

"UPDATED" POW/MIA FLAG -- OFFICIAL DISPLAY DAYS. Under previous Public Law 105-85 (Nov. 16, 1997), it indicated there were only six days that federal agencies, military installations and U.S. post offices were required to display the POW/MIA flag. Now under new law, Public Law 116-67 (Feb. 21, 2020), it is required that the POW/MIA flag be flown on all days on which the flag of the United States is displayed. To purchase a POW/MIA flag, go to vfwstore.org/products/GP237.

IRS AND VFW AWARD MONIES. The Internal Revenue Service (IRS) requires that any recipient that receives more than a \$599 award should receive a Form 1099 identifying the proceeds as taxable. This will include the VFW programs Patriot's Pen and Smart/Maher VFW National Citizenship Education Teacher Award.

"Buddy"® Poppy

NATIONAL "BUDDY" POPPY DISPLAY CONTEST. The time frame for registering and setting up the Department winning Buddy Poppy displays for the national judging at convention will be the same as usual. Department winning entries will be accepted for registration and may be set up beginning at 8:00 a.m., Saturday, July 22, until noon, Monday, July 24, 2023. Winning displays will be identified with appropriate ribbons on Tuesday morning and announced later on the convention floor. Displays must be removed prior to 11:30 a.m. on Wednesday afternoon. Any displays left after this time, will be removed for disposal by convention center personnel during the disassembly of the hall.

"BUDDY"® POPPY CAMPAIGN. Although we emphasize Buddy Poppies on Veterans Day and Memorial Day, it is important to realize that the distribution of Buddy Poppies should be a year-round exercise. Each time a Post participates in an activity where the public will be present, Buddy Poppies should be present as a fundraising tool and simply to recognize our fallen comrades. Where the VFW appears, Buddy Poppies should be a constant reminder that we will never forget those who have perished in the name of liberty. Just as "They Gave, Will You?" is a year-round thing, so should the distribution of VFW Buddy Poppies.

Remember that your poppies should be ordered a minimum of 8 weeks in advance of your distribution date. Be sure to specify a date by which the poppies are required; do not use "ASAP."

BUDDY POPPY UPDATE: National Headquarters conducted a review of the Buddy Poppy policy and procedures and implemented the following changes effective May 20, 2021:

- 1) If you do not receive your order within 8 weeks of placing it with your Department, please contact National Headquarters to report that you have not received the order.
- 2) If you do not report a missing order 3 months after the 8-week processing time, the order will NOT be replaced free of charge, and you will have to resubmit your order.

Miscellaneous items (coin cans, buttons, posters, etc.) should be ordered directly from the VFW Store at vfwstore.org/category/programs/buddypoppy or the VFW Store/Emblem and Supply Catalog.

The Manual of Procedure provides that Post relief funds may be used for programs such as Voice of Democracy, Patriot's Pen, Citizenship Education, and Community Service as long as suggestions in the chairperson's guidebooks are used as an example of promoting these programs.

Posts are further reminded that Section 711 of the Manual of Procedure provides that non-profit organizations, exempt from taxes under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code, may assist with the distribution of Buddy Poppies, provided there shall be no division of proceeds. A donation to these groups may be made from the Post general fund.

VFW SILVER, GOLD AND DIAMOND ANNIVERSARY POPPIES. The silver, gold and diamond anniversary Buddy Poppies are for Posts that are currently in their 25th, 50th or 75th anniversary years. For Posts currently in their 100th year anniversary, they can order any color and as many as they need. The anniversary poppies are approximately three times as expensive for us to produce, but because of the small quantities we deal in, we do not pass those costs on to the Posts. Please limit your order of anniversary poppies to 1,000 to ensure stock does not run out unless you are currently in your 100th year. These are ordered through the Department and processed the same as the red poppies. Annotate on the order to National that it is for anniversary poppies and specify which one.

National Veterans Service

POST SERVICE OFFICER SCHOOL OF INSTRUCTION

In accordance with the National Veterans Service Policy & Procedure, one of the duties of the Department Service Officer (DSO) is to conduct at least one VFW Post Service Officers School of Instruction for all Post, County and District Service Officers in the Department, during each VFW year. After conducting such training, DSOs shall provide an annual Post Service Officer School of Instruction report to both their Department Headquarters and the Director, National Veterans Service by the end of June. The report shall include the date and location of the training, topics taught, and a roster of attendees. The report for the Director, National Veterans Service, should be sent to taldana@vfw.org.

Of note, holding a PSO School of Instruction is also one of the criteria to qualify for the All-American Program. The other National Veterans Service criteria for All-American are to have a State/Department Service Officer and for that Department Service Officer to successfully complete NVS training with a passing grade of 70% or higher.

MEMORIAL DAY

This year, we will be celebrating Memorial Day on Monday, May 29, 2023. Originally called "Decoration Day," Memorial Day is observed to honor those who died while serving in the U.S. military.

While many Americans will celebrate the holiday with their families, countless VFW-accredited service representatives will be spending their day volunteering at Memorial Day events answering questions about VA benefits and assisting our Nation's veterans and their families in their quest to obtain their earned entitlements. Whether having a presence on the National Mall over a weekend of remembrance or visiting an unaccompanied hospitalized veteran in a VA Medical Center, the value a Service Officer brings to the lives of others cannot be underestimated.

PACT ACT

VFW National Veterans Service recently launched a website to help veterans, their family members or survivors learn if they may be eligible for benefits under the PACT Act. Those who are interested can log on

to <u>pactactinfo.org</u>, answer a few brief questions and determine if they may qualify. This tool makes direct referrals to our network of professionally trained, accredited representatives who can assist with applying for VA Disability benefits. Please refer those who may have questions about their eligibility to this website as we continue to try to reach as many veterans as possible.

National Legislative Service/Action Corps

Your Voice on Capitol Hill

The National Legislative Service staff regularly testifies before Congress on behalf of our VFW members. Our testimonies cover a wide array of issues that are critically important to veterans from all eras, as well as current active duty and Guard/Reserve service members and their families. We have been invited to testify before the House and Senate Committees on Veterans' Affairs on many different topics such as Department of Veterans Affairs' accountability; mental health services and suicide prevention; needs specific to women veterans; toxic exposure; transition assistance; education and employment; concurrent receipt and retirement compensation; and numerous pieces of pending legislation concerning veterans' earned benefits, care options, and delivery. All of our testimonies are posted on the VFW website.

In addition to providing testimony, we also regularly have one-on-one meetings and conversations with senators, representatives, and key committee staffers to field questions and provide detailed information regarding the VFW's position on specific issues. Making sure our veterans receive the benefits and care they deserve is paramount and always our priority, and your members of Congress know it. They often reach out to ask for our input and support on issues they know are important to our membership. We stand firm with our legislative priorities, and Congress listens.

If you don't already receive it, <u>sign up</u> for the *Action Corps Weekly* e-newsletter. You will receive updates on what is happening on Capitol Hill. It also provides a way for you to take action by responding to Action Alerts when the VFW needs to use its full power on crucial legislative issues.

Administrative Operations

Post Election Reports must be submitted no later than June 1 to the National Headquarters. We encourage all Post Quartermasters to use the online Election Report process featured in the Online Membership System (OMS), which is located behind the member's "LOGIN" at yfw.org.

The 2023-24 Department Roster is now an Online Membership System (OMS) submitted report. The interactive report will cover reporting of all Department elected and appointed officers and committee chairman. In addition, the District Election Report is also contained within the Online Membership System (OMS). Portions of the District report will feed into the Department report (i.e. the District Commander position).

Adjutants and Quartermasters can access the roster by logging into their OMS account under the "Election Report" drop down in the left hand navigation pane. Membership numbers of each elected/appointed officer and/or chairman is needed to complete the report. Your cooperation in completing the roster immediately following your convention is appreciated. Any additions, corrections or changes will be submitted through OMS as they occur throughout the year.

General Orders No. 10

2022-23 Series



- 1. Per Section 213 of the National Bylaws, Posts that have not submitted a properly completed Post Election Report by June 1 are in arrears and shall be deprived of all representation in District, Department and National Conventions. Such representation shall be restored promptly upon proper adjustments of such deficiencies. Posts that have registered delegates for the Department and National Conventions will not receive credentials until the Post has satisfied their arrearage.
- Attention is directed to the provision of Section 222 (d) of the National Bylaws, "Each Post will pay, in advance, a National Convention registration fee of twenty-five dollars (\$25) which shall entitle the Post to a packet of convention information and materials and one identified registered delegate for the National Convention. Each additional delegate attending the National Convention will pay a ten dollar (\$10) delegate fee." Post Quartermasters are encouraged to register their delegate(s) online through the Online Membership System (OMS). Posts failing to comply with this provision will be considered delinquent and in arrears.
